Do you know the differences between *religious priests* and *diocesan priests*?

Religious Priests

Often called order priests, religious priests can be assigned to any location and any ministry where their religious congregation is present. They profess vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience to their community. Their ministries support the charism of their individual congregation.

Diocesan Priests

Diocesan priests are responsible primarily to the bishop of a particular diocese, a specific geographical region of the church. Within this region, the priest usually serves in a parish, though he may be involved in other ministries like administration, communications, teaching and hospital or prison chaplaincy. Diocesan priests do not profess vows but promise chastity and obedience to their bishop. "For Divine Word Missionaries, interculturality is fundamental in our community life and it is a gift and a witness that we can also offer the world and the Church."

Journey to Priesthood

Divine Word Missionaries

Your journey to become a Divine Word Missionary priest begins with discernment and formation, a process of personal reflection, prayer, and instruction.

What Is Discernment?

Discernment is a personal and spiritual journey that allows you to discover and respond to God's call.



What are the Steps to Becoming an SVD Priest?

PRE-NOVITIATE FORMATION	Participate in prerequisite undergraduate education and early spiritual formation
NOVITIATE	Spend a year in prayer, reflection and study of consecrated religious life and the charism of the Society of the Divine Word (SVD) with a special focus on discernment
FIRST VOWS	Profess temporary vows of poverty, chastity and obedience as a member of the Society of the Divine Word
THEOLOGY STUDIES	Live at the Divine Word Theologate in Chicago and study at the Catholic Theological Union while living together in community and working toward a Master of Divinity
CLINICAL PASTORAL EDUCATION	Spend the summer after your first year of theological study participating in a program of Clinical Pastoral Education, which is generally in a hospital setting
CROSS-CULTURAL TRAINING PROGRAM (CTP)	Spend one to three years, after completing two years toward your Master of Divinity, embarking on a missionary assignment to experience what life will be like as a Divine Word Missionary and participating in a ministry that grounds you in your missionary vocation
CONTINUED STUDIES	Return to the Divine Word Theologate in Chicago to complete your Master of Divinity
PERPETUAL VOWS	Profess perpetual vows of poverty, chastity and obedience as a Divine Word Missionary
ORDINATION	Participate in your Diaconate ordination and spend several months assisting in parish ministry as a transitional deacon before being ordained to the priesthood
